NEW BUSINESS FROM BOARD/PUBLIC

Mr. Cavalli recognized a staff member who had passed away recently and asked for a moment of silence in his memory.

Several staff members, parents and students spoke in support of a supervisor who was nonrenewed for the 2017-2018 school year. They asked the board to reconsider and renew the supervisor.

Ms. Michele Parise thanked the board for waiving the activity fee in the 2017-2018 budget.

Mr. Alan Wirsul noted the upcoming Memorial Day holiday and wished to honor our military men and women who have served. Mr. Wirsul then mentioned that he has emailed the board with no reply to date. Mr. Wirsul noted his lack of trust in the board by citing the changes made to the 17-18 tentative approved budget as presented at the public hearing. Mr. Wirsul questioned if there have been any steps taken, meetings held or any explanation to resolve the issue of the Physics First curriculum.

Mr. Cavalli expressed his appreciation for the presence of all of the district staff at the meeting and appreciates the confidence of the staff. Mr. Cavalli said that no action will be taken on the issue of the administrator non-renewal at this time, and the board will need further information to consider. Mr. Cavalli added that he feels the presence of staff members at the meeting is an opportunity for solutions. Mr. Cavalli expressed his belief that the Strategic Planning initiative will provide a solid foundation for collaboration in the very near future.

Mr. Cavalli responded to Mr. Wirsul by informing him that the Physics First issue has been discussed with both teachers and administrators, and the issue will be looked at in greater detail.

Ms. Wells responded to Mr. Wirsul by informing him that she was in receipt of the email but felt that a verbal response to his inquiries would be more clarifying. Ms. Wells offered to meet with Mr. Wirsul in private to discuss his questions.

COMMITTEE/REPRESENTATIVE REPORTS

Representative Reports

Ms. Helen Zhang, student representative, addressed the issue of the non-renewed supervisor. She discussed the annual art extravaganza which showcases some of Montgomery Township's most amazing student artwork. It features stunning portfolios of art students who have worked tirelessly for the past few months to create amazing pieces of work. The wide range of art on display, from kindergarten to high school, exemplified the beauty found in all forms of art no matter found at which level. At the extravaganza, NAHS held its annual silent auction, where individuals bid on their favorite art pieces created by students. This was an exciting chance for parents and others to take home some student made work, all while contributing to the art effort within schools.

Ms. Zhang also spoke about MontyHacks, which is an entirely student run event hosted by the Montgomery Computer Science Club in partnership with YECNJ. According to their mission statement, "MontyHacks was founded on the idea that all should be able to build and create. They believe that all should have the opportunity to impact and benefit the community. One of their main goals is to make cutting-edge technology accessible so that everyone has the ability to learn, grow, and create. They believe this event will not only foster growth in the STEM community but also help those discover their shared passions for Computer Science and technology." The turnout at MontyHacks was amazing. Members of the community, no matter what age, came out to support and learn from the MHS students. At the event, one parent of a student stated, "Seeing these students teach one another and learn from each other really epitomizes what kind of student body is at MHS. The passion they have for this subject is inspiring."

Lastly, MHS students are in the AP exam studying zone. Students are seen forming study groups again to review with their peers. The MHS class of 2017's senior prom was held a few weeks ago, and students had the time of their lives!
