1.4 <u>Resolution Opposing Delay in Transmission of Property Tax Revenue to School Districts</u> – approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 3902, currently pending in the State Legislature, would authorize the Department of Community Affairs to permit municipalities to delay the transmission of property tax revenues to school districts during gubernatorial-declared emergencies; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey's public schools are highly dependent on property tax revenue to support education programs; and

WHEREAS, on average, local property taxes constitute close to 60% of public school revenue, with the percentage even greater in other districts such as Montgomery where it constitutes 86%; and

WHEREAS, a delay in payments from municipalities would result in a financial crisis for school districts, seriously disrupting the educational process—and bringing it to a halt; and

WHEREAS, although public school buildings are closed during the current health emergency, the education of our students is taking place through remote learning and home instruction; and

WHEREAS, continued timely transmission of school property taxes is critical for the education process to continue without interruption; and

WHEREAS, even though municipalities are designated as the authorities to collect property taxes, these taxes are levied for specific purposes—e.g., municipal, school, county, fire district—and these obligations must continue to be met; and

WHEREAS, as currently written, A-3902, which is intended to ease a financial burden on municipalities, would place a severe strain on school districts and the students and families that they serve; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery Township Board of Education recognizes the impact of the current public health emergency on the state and local governments, as well as local school districts, but believes this legislation would worsen the situation for our communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Montgomery Township Board of Education urges the State Senate and the Governor to oppose A-3902; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this resolution be delivered to Governor Phil Murphy, State Senate President Stephen M. Sweeney, Assembly Speaker Craig Coughlin; and the 16th Legislative District's representatives in the state Senate and General Assembly; and be it further

RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to the New Jersey School Boards Association.

Management Fee. Chartwells shall charge the Local Education Agency a Management Fee of Eleven Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-Four dollars (\$11,394) per month for the ten (10) months for an annual total of One Hundred Thirteen Thousand Nine Hundred Forty dollars (\$113,940) during the academic year.

2) GUARANTEE

<u>Guaranteed Return</u>. Chartwells guarantees that the return to the LEA from the Food Service Program for the school year will be at least \$75,000 and is unlimited. Guarantee Reimbursement conditions and assumptions remain the same as previously agreed upon in the First Renewal Fee contract.

The Board President and Business Administrator/Board Secretary are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Settlement Agreement and Release and any other documents necessary to effectuate the Settlement Agreement.
- 3.9 <u>Appointment of Professional Service</u> approve the appointment of Phoenix Advisors as Financial Advisor for Continuing Disclosure Agent services for \$1,000 base fee and \$200 initial setup fee for each new bond issue set up during the year for the 2020-2021 school year.
- 3.10 Approve the Following Resolution Regarding the Refunding of all or a Portion of the Outstanding Callable School Bonds –

REFUNDING BOND ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MONTGOMERY IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY, PROVIDING FOR THE REFUNDING OF ALL OR A PORTION OF THE OUTSTANDING CALLABLE SCHOOL BONDS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, DATED FEBRUARY 25, 2010, ISSUED IN THE ORIGINAL PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$14,125,000, AND/OR ALL OR A PORTION OF THE OUTSTANDING CALLABLE REFUNDING SCHOOL BONDS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, DATED MAY 10, 2011, ISSUED IN THE ORIGINAL PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$17,215,000, APPROPRIATING NOT TO EXCEED \$11,000,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE **ISSUANCE** OF **NOT** TO **EXCEED** \$11,000,000 REFUNDING BONDS TO PROVIDE FOR SUCH REFUNDING

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MONTGOMERY IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board of Education of the Township of Montgomery in the County of Somerset, New Jersey (the "School District") is hereby authorized to refund all or a portion of the outstanding callable School Bonds of the School District originally issued in the principal amount of \$14,125,000 and dated February 25, 2010 (the "2010 Bonds") and/or to refund all or a portion of the outstanding callable Refunding School Bonds of the School District issued in the original principal amount of \$17,215,000 and dated May 10, 2011 (the "2011 Bonds") (the 2010 Bonds and the 2011 Bonds are collectively referred to herein as the "Prior Bonds").

The 2010 Bonds maturing on or after September 1, 2021 (the "2010 Refunded Bonds") may be redeemed at the option of the School District in whole or in part on any date on or after September 1, 2020 (the "2010 Redemption Date") at a redemption price equal to 100% of the 2010 Refunded Bonds to be redeemed plus accrued interest, if any, to the 2010 Redemption Date.

The 2011 Bonds maturing on or after August 1, 2021 (the "2011 Refunded Bonds") may be redeemed at the option of the School District in whole or in part on any date on or after August 1, 2020 (the "2011 Redemption Date") at a redemption price equal to the par amount of the 2011 Refunded Bonds to be redeemed plus accrued interest, if any, to the 2011 Redemption Date.

- Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the purpose described in Section 1 hereof, negotiable refunding bonds (the "Refunding Bonds") are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$11,000,000 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61 et seq.
- Section 3. An aggregate amount not exceeding \$150,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61.4 has been included in the aggregate principal amount of Refunding Bonds authorized herein.
- Section 4. The purpose of the refunding is to incur an interest cost savings for the School District.
- Section 5. A supplemental debt statement has been prepared and filed in the offices of the Montgomery Township Clerk and the Rocky Hill Borough Clerk (collectively, the "Constituent Municipalities") and the Business Administrator/Board Secretary and in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey as required by law. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Constituent Municipalities as defined in the Local Bond Law and the school debt of the School District is increased by the amount the Refunding Bond authorization exceeds the amount of the proposed refunded bonds.
- Section 6. No Local Finance Board approval is required as the issuance of the Refunding Bonds will comply with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:30-2.5.
- Section 7. The Board President, the Superintendent, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary and other appropriate representatives of the School District are hereby authorized to prepare such documents, to publish such notices and to take such other actions as are necessary or desirable to enable the School District to prepare for the sale and the issuance of the Refunding Bonds authorized herein and to provide for the redemption of Prior Bonds referred to in Section 1 hereof.
- Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect immediately after final adoption.

- 3.11 Approval of New Jersey Schools Insurance Group (NJSIG) Safety Grant Program Application
 approve the submission of a grant application for the Safety Grant Program through the New
 Jersey Schools Insurance group in the amount of \$20,481.99 for the 2020-21 school year.
